Siblings Killed In Construction Zone Accident

18-Wheeler Rear-Ended Their Car

\$9.5 Million Settlement

The mother of a 21-year-old and a 17-year-old who were killed in a construction zone accident sued for wrong-ful death.

On June 30, 2002, the two siblings were stopped in a construction zone on Interstate 80 in Grand Island, Neb., after they were involved in a fender-bender. An 18-wheel tanker truck then rear-ended their vehicle. The siblings survived impact but died in a subsequent fire.

The mother sued the truck driver and his employer in Jackson County, since the tanker company was a Missouri company. She claimed the driver was negligent in that, among other things, he ignored warnings of lane drop in the construction zone.

The parties settled before trial for \$9.5 million — \$4.75 million for each fatality — and dismissed with prejudice the third-party claim against the sibling who was driving the vehicle.
